Bradford School Playground Rules

(Updated July 2016)

- 1.) Be respectful, responsible and safe
- 2.) Follow instructions of playground staff
- Only playground balls and frisbees can be thrown
- Real or pretend fighting not allowed
- Run only in grassy areas
- Walking feet on wood chips and equipment areas
- Do not flip swings or jump from them
- Ask adult to retrieve balls that go over the fence
- Benches are for sitting only
- Go down slides feet first only
- Retrieve and return all equipment at end of recess
- At end of recess, first whistle means freeze, second whistle means line up quickly and quietly in grade level lines.

SCAN

- Examine the environment frequently.
- Notice b0th inappropriate and appropriate behaviors.

MOVE

- Move around the entire area unpredictably.
- Visit problem areas frequently.

INTERACT

- Elicit conversations with students.
- Provide pre-corrections and reminders.
- Provide positive reinforcers.

LEARN

- Learn from students what games they play.
- Ask students questions. Show interest.
